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2019 CALIFORNIA LICENSED FORESTERS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION & INSTRUCTIONS

The California Licensed Foresters Association (CLFA) is accepting scholarship applications from students pursuing an education in Forestry. The scholarship is available to individuals who will be attending, full-time during the 2018/2019 school year, a University or College with a Forestry Program accredited by the Society of American Foresters (SAF) **OR** a Junior College with transferable credits to an accredited Forestry Program. The application must be sponsored by a voting member of CLFA, a Professor of a University or College with a Forestry Program accredited by the Society of American Foresters (SAF) or a Junior College with transferable credits to an accredited Forestry Program.

The successful applicant will be awarded a \$1,500 scholarship, and complimentary admission to the CLFA Annual Conference, to be held in March 8-9, 2019, at the Gaia in Anderson, CA. To receive payment, the successful applicant will be required to submit an enrollment verification form to CLFA.

CLFA, with a membership responsible for the sustained management of millions of acres of California forestland, represents the common interests of California Registered Professional Foresters. The Association provides opportunities for continuing education and public outreach to its membership, which includes professionals affiliated with government agencies, private timber companies, consultants, the public, and the academic community. Governed by an elected Board of Directors, CLFA was established in 1980 after the passage of the landmark California Professional Foresters Law.
