## **Park Land Resource Manager**

**Hiring salary range: \$80,000 to \$95,000**

Travis County's Transportation and Natural Resources (TNR) department is seeking to fill the Park Land Resource Manager position. This is an exciting role for an experienced leader to manage, plan, organize, and supervise the land resource management program in Travis County Parks, which includes the management of forestry resources, stewardship activities, and wildland fire/RxFire program in parks, preserves, and other managed open space, including county owned school lands. Travis County residents approved a Bond Issuance in November 2023 that will provide over \$200 million for Strategic Parkland Acquisition and Conservation.

This is a key role in managing the undeveloped County parks and conservation lands, including greenways, floodplain buyout lands, hazard mitigation properties, conservation easements, and county owned school lands; the organizational and operational activities of the park land management program for Travis County Parks; the forestry program for the Travis County Parks system to promote forestry health and mitigate hazardous conditions for the public; and the stewardship program for the Travis County Park system, which administers agriculture leases, land restoration activities, fire ecology, and ecosystem restoration/management, including the 18,880-acre county-owned school property in Throckmorton County.

Candidates shall have experience with all aspects of land management activities, including prescribed fire, mechanical treatment, restoration efforts, and herbicide applications; current forestry management practices; land stewardship and ecological restoration practices; National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) guidelines for wildfire and prescribed fire management; land/resource management planning; and fire Management planning. Requirements include a bachelor's degree in Natural Resources, Business Administration, Environmental Engineering or a directly related field and seven (7) years of experience in environmental and resource management activities, including three (3) years of mid- to senior level supervisory or management experience. Fire ecology experience preferred.
